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
Wisconsin State Fair Park GBAC STAR Accreditation

Cleaning Up with a New Collaboration

A collaboration between the Global Biorisk Advisory CouncilTM, a Division of ISSA, the worldwide cleaning industry association, and IAEE, the leading trade association for the global exhibitions and events industry, is bringing positive results to cleaning, disinfection and infectious disease-prevention efforts that will benefit thousands of key stakeholders.

Expo! Expo! IAEE's Annual Meeting and Exhibition became the first trade show event to be awarded the GBAC STAR™ Event designation, outside of our own ISSA Show North America, held in November. Under the guidance of the GBAC STAR Event criteria, Expo! Expo! coordinated stringent yet efficient planning and event protocols for cleaning, disinfection and infectious disease prevention. This process was simplified by hosting the event at a GBAC STAR Accredited Facility — The Pennsylvania Convention Center and by utilizing a GBAC STAR Accredited Service Provider — United Service

Companies. This allowed the three parties to focus on the health and safety of the organizers and attendees to provide a confident experience at the show by using their established GBAC STAR Accredited processes.

Expo! Expo! IAEE's Annual Meeting and Exhibition, which was held in December 2021 in Philadelphia, is referred to as the "show for shows." Thousands of exhibition and events industry professionals attend this gathering to learn about the latest industry trends and technology, and network with colleagues.

And the collaboration between IAEE and GBAC continues to blossom. At this time, the finishing touches are being made to a training module that helps event planners make informed decisions based on infection prevention and public health.

"We recently launched a 30-minute Infectious Disease Awareness course that is targeted to have a broader reach than our longer certification courses. We want to get the most critical information about infection prevention to the largest audience we can, particularly the frontline cleaning professionals and their supervisors," Steve Arehart, Director of Technical Operations, GBAC, said. "With the help of IAEE, we're developing an event planner's training module to add to this awareness course. It contains guidance for planners to consider when making key event planning decisions such as:

- What the expectations should be from your hosting facility or your hired cleaning contractor
- · Understanding the role of a safety committee when planning an event
- How local and federal compliance factors into your decisions.

IAEE provides the expertise and experience in what it takes to plan an event, and we lean on our community of infectious disease and public health experts to adapt those plans to not only have a smooth event but also have a safe and healthy event."

The Event Planner Training Module will be publicized upon its completion in all of our GBAC media.

The virtual accreditation is performance-based and requires documentation for 38 elements, including cleaning and disinfection chemicals; goals, objectives,

and targets related to guest satisfaction for medical travel and wellness guests; audits and inspections; and emergency planning and response.

"We have seen travelers' expectations evolve during the pandemic," Karen Timmons, CEO, GHA, said. "As we move past the pandemic, there is growing evidence that travelers will increasingly look for validation of safety, cleanliness and quest experience before booking a trip.
